Directions:

From Fayetteville, Take 540 North towards Bentonville, exit #86. Go West on Hwy 102, Legends is 15 miles on the left. Through Centerton towards Decatur. Go past the paved drive entrance to the next entrance (about 1/4 mile further) left into the pasture. 17341 W Hwy 102 Decatur, AR 72722

From Tulsa, Take 412/Cherokee Turn Pike East. To Siloam Springs. Go all the way through town, 1st light past the Wal-Mart and Lowe's is Hwy 59. Turn left or North onto Hwy 59 towards Gentry. Go through Gentry to Decatur. At stop sign/flashing light in Decatur, turn right (East). LEC is 2 miles on the right—go past concrete driveway and turn directly into the next pasture on your right.

Show Rules:

- A Ring Steward is on duty for show safety, mgmt, schooling and questions. Please do not approach judge during the show.
- Proper show attire required (exception of classes 1-3, see rules on www.nwahja.com). ASTM/SEI protective headgear required when mounted.
- One Year negative Coggins is REQUIRED, checked upon arrival.
- Classes 1-14 will be pinned through 10th place if entries warrant, points for year-end awarded through 6th place.
- A horse/rider combination may only cross enter into divisions with fence heights of a six (6) inch difference. This includes flat and under saddle classes. Jumper classes excluded.
- Mgmt reserves the right to cancel a class/division with less than 3.
- The 1 minute rule will be enforced at all times.
- In order to accumulate points for year-end awards rider must be a member of NWAHJA and volunteer 4 hours over the course of NWAHJA show season.
- A horse known to kick must wear a red ribbon in its tail as a warning.
- Entry into one over fences class in a division is prohibited. Must enter whole division or only the under saddle/flat class.

HUNTER & EQUITATION CLASSES & DIVISIONS

Pleasure: Amateurs Only. This division is for entry-level riders only. Rider may not enter any other classes at show. Class number 1 and 2 are under-saddle only, riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. Class number 3 may include two (2) ground poles placed separately to be trotted over.

Open Walk-Trot Under Saddle: Open to all. Riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. Class may be split between professionals and amateurs if entries warrant.

Beginner Walk/Trot Hunter and Equitation: Amateurs Only. The course for this division will be four (4) 12" crossbars set as two (2) lines, one line on each side of ring. The rider will jump once around only. The rider may trot the entire course or trot to the line and canter away. Riders may not canter in to any first fence of a line. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other division is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Intermediate Walk/Trot Hunter and Equitation: Amateurs Only. The course will be 12" crossbars with optional diagonal lines or a single fence present. The rider may trot the entire course, trot to the line and canter away, or canter the entire course. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other division is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Maiden Hunter: Open to horses or ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences. The course will be seven (7) or eight (8) jumps consisting of 12" crossbars and/or 18" verticals. For the under-saddle class riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in both directions.

Leadline: No age limit. Horse or pony must be led/controlled by a qualified horse leader. Entrants may not enter any other classes in show.

Progressive Hunter: Riders must be 12 years of age or over. If warranted, classes may be divided into age groups 12-17 and 18 - up. The jumps will include 18" crossbars, 18" verticals and 2' verticals. The riders will show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under saddle class.

Prince G Weldon Equitation Classic: (Class EQ1) Fences 18". Riders will design a course consisting of at least 9 fences and turn in to paddock master after schooling break.

Short Stirrup (11 & under) Long Stirrup (12 & over) Hunter and Equitation: Amateurs only. The courses are simple with seven (7) or eight (8) small 18" verticals. Entrants are encouraged to canter the courses as a stepping stone towards more advanced divisions. On the flat and in the under-saddle class, the riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in both directions.

2' Hunter: Open to all. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2' in height, with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

2' Am Hunter & Equitation: Amateurs only. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2' in height with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle.

Pony Hunter: Open to small, medium or large ponies. Fences set at heights of 2', 2'3" or 2'6". Entrant may decide which height to compete in regardless of pony's height. Rounds will be ridden throughout the day as courses are changed for other divisions. Riders will be asked to show their ponies at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

Baby Green Hunter: Open to horses or ponies in their first or second consecutive year of showing in a competition over fences. The courses consist of fences not to exceed 2'3" in height, with small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. The riders will be asked to show their horses at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

Modified Amateur Hunter: Amateurs only. Fence heights 2'3"

Education Equitation: Amateurs only. Scholarship class. Riders may choose fence heights of 2'6" or 2'9". Rounds will be ridden throughout the day as course heights are changed for other divisions. Open to all amateur riders regardless of age or membership. Application and guidelines can be found at www.nwahja.com

NWAHJA Hunter: Open to all. Fence heights 2'6"

HHJ-Equitation Classic: (Class EQ2) Fences 2'6". Riders will design a course consisting of at least 9 fences and turn in to paddock master at the end of the 2'6" schooling break.

Low Hunter: Open to all. Fence heights 2'9"

3' Hunter: Open to all. Fence heights 3'

MEDAL CLASSES

Warm-Up: (Saturday Class #A), (Sunday Class #B) Open to All. Warm-Up rounds can be ridden before any hunter class (**excluding** all cross-rail classes and Maiden Hunter), and will be judged. Riders cannot ride a warm-up round before any Equitation class or Jumper Classes.

Medal Classes: Junior and Amateurs only. Equitation classes. The rider must be a member of NWAHJA in good standing and the horse must be owned by a member of NWAHJA in good standing in order to enter this class. This is an equitation class over a course that is moderately more difficult than a typical hunter course. The course stresses competent and accurate riding skills. The top four riders after the first round may be called back for additional testing. All riders accumulating 13 points or more in their division through the show season will qualify for the medal finals held at the NWAHJA Year-End Show. There will be qualifying medal classes held at the Year-End Show with the finals held after.

2' Medal 2' fences, may have oxers with maximum spread of 2'. USEF Tests 1-6 may be used for work-off on the flat.

NWAHJA Medal Fences 2'6". USEF Tests 1-13 may be used for a work-off.

Progressive Medal This is a test of an individual as a show jumping rider. Exhibitors will show over a course of no less than eight fences and may choose from heights 2'9", 3', or 3'3". At any time during the show season the rider may choose a different height, lower or higher. Rounds will be ridden throughout the day as course heights are changed for other divisions. The course must include a combination and at least three of the following:

- Bending Lines
- Narrow Jump (6'8")
- Roll-Back Turn
- Fence at the End of the Ring

Long Approach to a Single Jump

To be judged on style and execution. Upon completion of the over fences phase all riders will be asked to come back to the ring for a flat phase on the same horse. Riders will be asked to show at the working walk, working trot sitting, the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. Riders being considered for an award will be asked for the working canter on the counter lead for at least one full revolution of the arena in both directions. Riders may be asked for additional tests. (see USEF tests 1-19 below) To be judged on rider's position, seat and the correctness and the effect of the aids. 2 contestants are required for the class to fill. All entries will qualify for the year end Medal Finals to be held at Harvest Run in November 2011. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. Riders may not cross enter into any other Medal Class.



USEF Tests From Which Judges Must Choose for Medal Classes

Tests may be performed either collectively or individually but no other tests may be used. Instructions must be publicly announced. A judge may ask riders to re-jump an abbreviated or shortened form of the original course. NOTE: In Hunter Seat Equitation classes, any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those competitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. If exhibitors are called back collectively to test, they must remain in the ring until all exhibitors have completed the test. Equitation tests must not have exhibitors trotting or cantering through in gate or out gate. Obstacles jumped in an equitation test must have been included in the original course. Jumps must be jumped in the original direction unless otherwise specified. BOD 1/17/10 Effective 12/1/10 EC 9/20/10 Effective 12/1/10

1. Halt (4 to 6 seconds) or halt and back. When riders working collectively are asked to halt and then back, they must not be penalized if they walk forward a few steps and halt after backing.
2. Hand gallop.
3. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals.
4. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead. This is a change whereby the horse is brought back into a walk or trot (either is acceptable unless the judge specifies) and restarted into a canter on the opposite lead. Figures to be commenced in center of two circles so that one change of lead is shown.
5. Work collectively or individually at a walk, trot and/or canter.
6. Jump low obstacles at a trot as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a trot jump is 3' for horses, 2' for ponies.
7. Jump obstacles on figure eight course.
8. Question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack and equipment and conformation.
9. Ride without stirrups, riders must be allowed option to cross stirrups.
10. Jump low obstacles at a walk as well as at a canter. The maximum height and spread for a walk jump is 2'.
11. Dismount and mount. Individually.
12. Turn on the forehand done through the walk or the halt.
13. Figure eight at canter on correct lead demonstrating flying change of lead.
14. Execute serpentine at a trot and/or canter on correct lead demonstrating simple or flying changes of lead. (See EQ113.4 for simple change.)
15. Change leads on a line demonstrating a simple or flying change of lead. (See EQ113.4 for simple change.)
16. Change horses. (Note: this test is the equivalent of two tests.)
17. Canter on counter lead. (Note: no more than twelve horses may counter canter at one time.)
18. Turn on the haunches from the walk.
19. Demonstration ride of approximately one minute. Rider must advise judge beforehand what ride he plans to demonstrate.

JUMPER CLASSES & DIVISIONS

Puddle Jumper Level 0: 2'3": (Classes 57-58) **Table IV, Sec 1:** Cross-Entry of horse/rider into Future Jumpers only. **Optimum time** will be set for the course, faults converted to time. Rider closest to Optimum time (over or under) win the class.

Future Jumper Level 0: 2'6-2'9": (Classes 63-64) **Table IV, Sec 1: Optimum time** will be set for the course, faults converted to time. Rider closest to Optimum time (over or under) win the class. **Table II, Sec 2b: First round is timed**, riders with a clear first round will, without leaving the ring, **upon audible signal, commence the jump-off course**. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide.

G1. Maverick's Gambler's Choice 2'3-3': 60 seconds allowed. Each obstacle will have a point value. Some fences may be jumped in both directions and will be indicated on course sheet, no points awarded for obstacle knocked down. Time will start once rider jumps first obstacle, blowing the whistle declares the end of the round. No points may be scored after the whistle has been blown. Each obstacle may be jumped ONLY twice. Jumping an obstacle for the 3rd time does not incur elimination. However, no points will be given to this obstacle. Winner will be who has obtained the highest number of points. In the event of a tie, there will be a jump-off according to the same formula with a fixed time of 30 seconds.

Training Jumper Level 1: 2'9"-3': (Classes 68-69) **Table II, Sec 2b:** same as above. **Table II, Sec 2c:** If a competitor has gone **clean in the first round** rider will, upon crossing the finish line, **commence the designated jump-off course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line** for the initial course. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide.

G2. Dash for the Cash 2'9-3": Riders will jump a course of 4-5 fences, then leave arena through one gate, return through another and finish the jumping course of 3-4 fences. Fastest clear round wins the class.

Open Jumper Level 2: 3'-3'3": (Classes 73-74) **Table II, Sec 2c:** same as above. **Table II, Sec 1:** Speed class, **first round is timed** and fastest clear round wins the class.

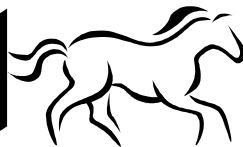

Prince G Weldon Classic is named for “George” who was retired in 2009 from the LEC lesson program at the age of 28! George became a lesson horse for me in 1998 at the age of 17, when I located him in Mansfield, Texas. I was at a farm looking at another horse and spotted him alone in an outside paddock. I immediately fell in love with him, and asked if he was for sale. As they say, the rest is history...countless students have begun their riding careers on George...he gets them over the fear of a tall horse right away! He is 16.2 and has at least 6” withers—which makes tacking interesting! His manner and soul are of greatness—he is truly one of a kind. George will spend his “golden years” roaming our pastures and I hope to be able to return the favor by providing him the best possible life from here on out.

HHJ Equitation Classic is named for a special group of 5 girls in Dallas, TX who helped Heather start her career as a riding instructor in 1998. One day they all came to their lesson with leather bracelets engraved with HHJ—and their name. They said it stood for Heather’s Hunter Jumpers. This was the beginning for countless other riders to join the show team and excel as equestrians!

Maverick’s Gambler’s Choice is aptly named for Icy Bluff or “Maverick” as he is called around the barn. Heather got him as a 3 year old off the track and uses him as her personal mount for all events—hunters, foxhunts, jumpers, trails—you name it he can do it. He is a fantastic mount who is always willing to go out and strut his stuff and take chances! A common statement around the barn is “Mavy can do it”.

Dash for the Cash is a newly added class for 2010 simply put it is a race to the finish, beginning the course in the arena jumping 4-5 elements, then leaving the arena for a fast paced sprint then back into the ring to finish over 3-4 more obstacles. Money and Plaque for winner, as well as bragging rights.
